

The City of Evanston is working with community volunteers to improve and care for natural areas along the banks of the North Shore Channel. As we remove invasives, we replace them with native trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants that provide food and shelter for pollinators and birds throughout the year. Other native habitat plantings are in Twiggs and Harbert Parks and in front of the Civic Center. The work is supported by a two-year grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation's Chi-Cal Rivers Fund.
